INTRODUCTION

With the mandate of advancing a Caribbean Urban Agenda and best practices among planning professionals, the Jamaica Institute of Planners (JIP) will be hosting the 2nd annual Caribbean Urban Forum 2012: Planning to achieve the vision...towards a Green Urban Economy from the 14th – 17th March, 2012 at the Jamaica Conference Centre, Kingston, Jamaica. This Forum is one in a series of regional events organized by the Caribbean Network for Urban and Land Management (CNULM), in association with the Caricom Secretariat. It is also being organized in conjunction with the Caribbean Institute of Planners and American Planning Association (APA). We will be showcasing examples of good planning and urban management practices from across the Caribbean, as well as to serve as the launching pad for the Caribbean Institute of Professional Planners.

What defines the Caribbean City? What are its features and how has it evolved? This session explores the nature of the Caribbean City.
2. Planning as a solution to urban and development challenges:
As we strive to achieve our visions for sustainable development, a wide variety of professionals are required to inject their knowledge and expertise into discovering a continuously

expanding plethora of solutions to the many problems plaguing Small Island States. The role of spatial planning and planners are especially crucial given the historical unbalanced and haphazard nature of development in Jamaica and the wider Caribbean Region. INTERNATIONAL CALL FOR PAPERS

The Jamaica Institute of Planners, and the Caribbean Network for Urban and Land Management, in partnership with the University of Technology, Jamaica, are pleased to announce the International Call for Papers for the 2nd Caribbean Urban Forum 2012: Planning to achieve the vision... towards a Green Urban Economy (CUF2012).

The CUF2012 Call for Papers aims to solicit presentations that examine thematic areas of the Caribbean urban agenda (listed below) as they relate to the emerging green economy agenda. The aim is to assemble diverse examples of urban planning and management practice and research that have been or can be implemented in a Caribbean and small island developing state context; that demonstrate the value of planning & urban management as offering solutions to urban issues and the green economy; and that make use of innovative tools and technologies that can be adapted and applied to the Caribbean context.

A secondary objective of the Call for Papers is to help define the Caribbean position for Rio + 20, the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development (UNCSD), in Brazil on June 4-6, 2012 and to prepare for a future Special Meeting of CARICOM Ministers on urban issues.

Thematic Areas of the Caribbean Urban Agenda:

- Local socio-economic development and Poverty alleviation
- Defining guiding principles for the Caribbean Green Economy
- Enabling mechanisms for government and professionals

- Governance (including Local Governance)
- The Informal Sector and urban issues
- Hazards Mitigation and Disaster Management in Urban Planning and Management
- Security & Safety Aspects of Urbanization
- Physical Living Conditions
- Inequality
- Sustainable Planning for Urban Development & management
- Institutional, including Legal Reform as a cross-cutting solution.

Call for Papers Submission Criteria:

- Submissions can include a single presentation or a proposal to support a full panel.
- Individual presenters will be expected to prepare a formal presentation of 15-20 minutes duration.
- Submissions should include a bio for each presenter and abstract (200 word maximum) for each presentation.
- Panels should include a mix of government officials and policy makers, multilateral and international perspectives, practitioners, civil society and academics/researchers.
