The Opportunity: Participating island countries to define and realize their own vision for a clean economy

Our Goal/Mission: To accelerate the transition of Caribbean island economies from a heavy dependence on fossil fuels to a diverse renewable energy mix, and create a blueprint for other isolated economies

Objectives:

- To support island countries to identify tailored clean energy solutions
- To develop a commercially viable renewable energy model for island countries
- To present island countries an opportunity to access the global market
- To catalyse the flow of private investment into renewables (\$300 million target)
- To produce a Ten Island Renewable Roadmap/Blueprint that will enable transition off fossil fuels

Anticipated Outcomes:

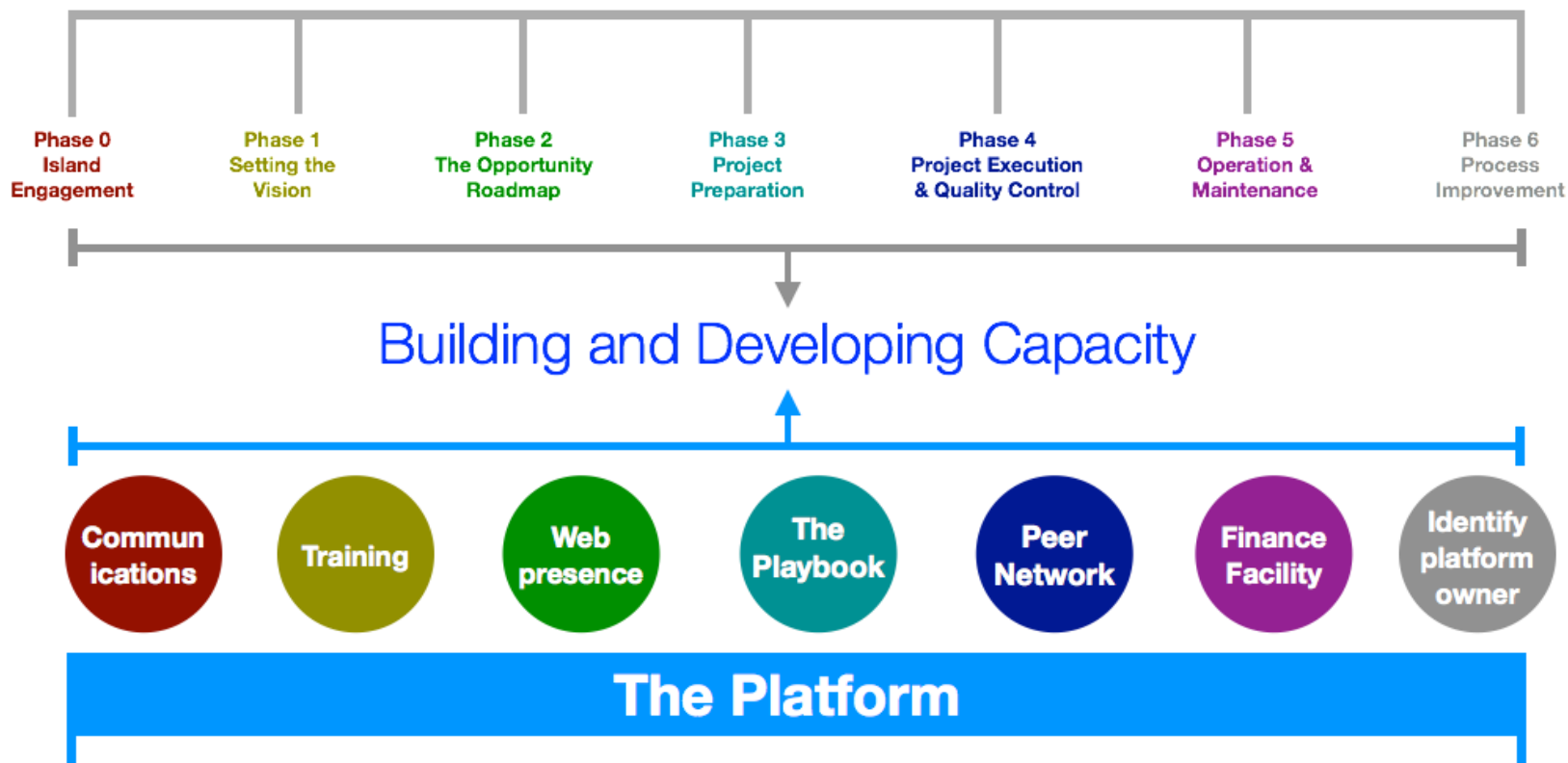
- A competitive renewable investment market established in participating countries

Outputs:

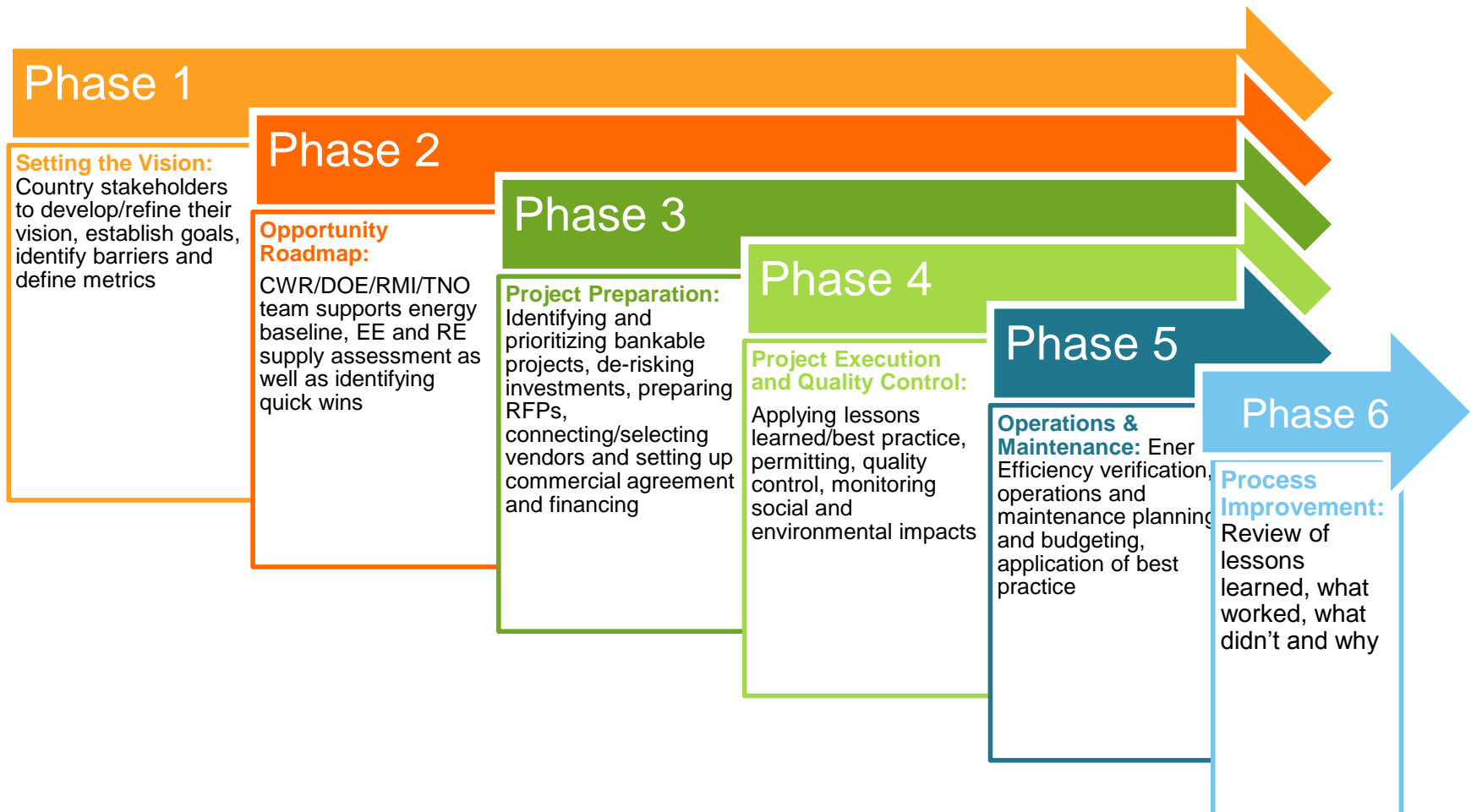
- Ten Island Renewable Roadmaps/ Blueprints

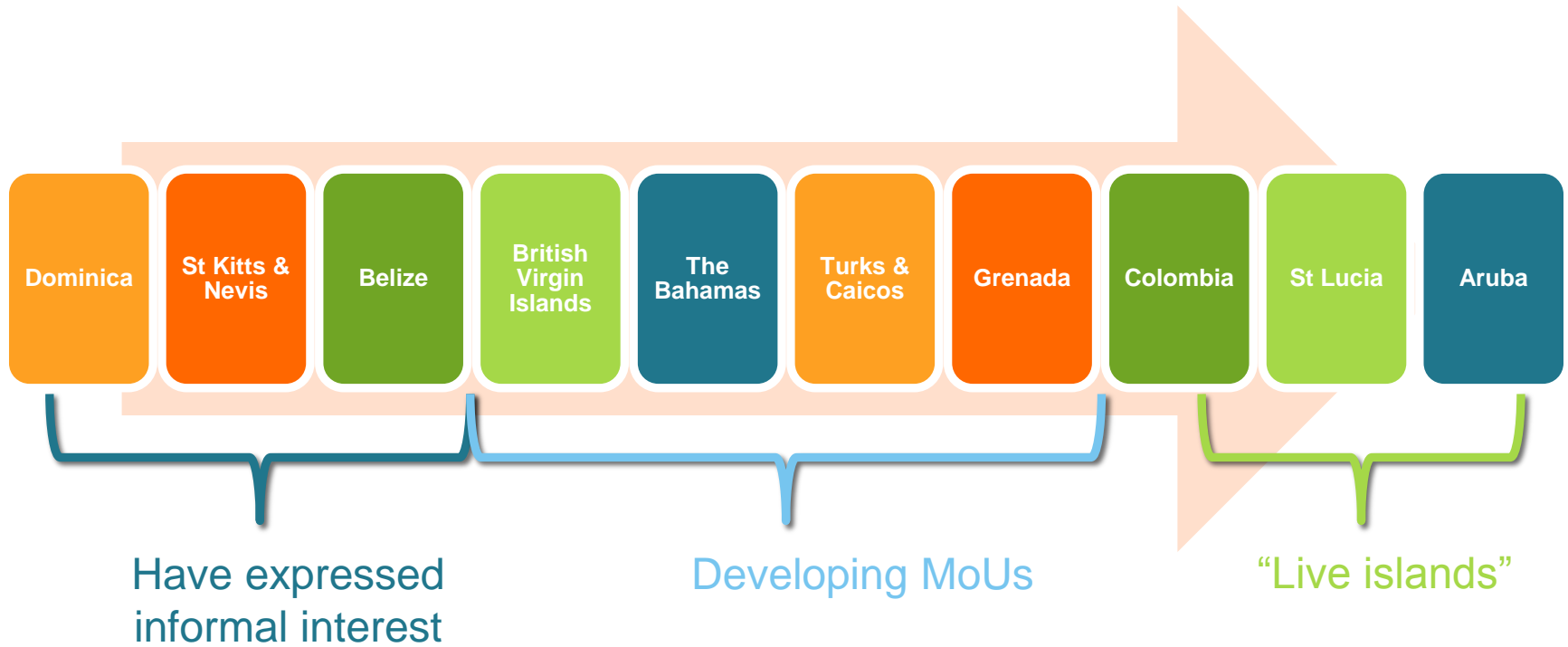
